6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

28 faculty members are members of BOS and syllabus framing sub-committees. These members, keeping in mind the global scenario of the higher education, prepare the drafts of syllabi of different classes.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Our Principal is a good administrator. With the help of two coordinators (Arts and Science) he manages and controls teaching and learning processes. The time table is strictly followed. The teachers on leave are asked to adjust their lectures. Besides the two coordinators, the institution has installed CCTV cameras in the classrooms to monitor the teaching and learning process. Unit tests are conducted to test the progress of the students. Through seminars, Industrial Study tours, and Wall Papers, the overall progress of the students is achieved.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

University has accepted the semester system for all the courses. As a result, semester examinations are conducted at the end of each semester by the University. Besides the university examinations, Mid-Term exams are conducted at the department level to check the progress of the students. Home Assignments are given to the students and seminars are conducted for the final year students.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research plays a crucial role in the development of the nation. Keeping this in mind, our college encourages and motivates teachers and students to participate in national and international seminars and work-shops. Our students are also encouraged to participate in Research Festival "Avishkar" organised at the University and State level by the honourable Chancellor of Maharashtra. The two Major and 16 Minor Research projects had been sent to the UGC for approval. Out of these, 12 Minor research projects worth Rs. 16.64 lakh have been sanctioned.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The construction of the New Library building is complete and it is now in use.
- We have **six LCD projectors** and they have been used for effective teaching.
- New instrumentations are bought for the science

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

We believe in Man Management. The proper utilization of the human resources leads to the development of the institution. By recognizing the potential of both teaching and non-teaching faculty, we have formed different committees to help the administration. The chair persons of these different committees help in day- to -day administration.

Both teaching faculty and non-teaching staff members are recruited as per the government policies. While giving appointments, quality is placed at the centre. Most of our Non-teaching staff appointed this year is highly qualified. However, adhoc appointments are made as per the need of the college.
